People that live, work in or visit Leeds are being encouraged to feedback on plans to improve key routes for alternative travel options like walking, wheeling\* and cycling.

Proposals aim to improve the design of city centre streets, making Leeds an easier place to get around and creating a more welcoming, safer environment for anyone that visits, or travels through the city.

The consultation focuses on transformations to the north and south of the city centre, extending from Great George Street (near Leeds General Infirmary) to Call Lane, and is part of the council's ambition to make Leeds a 'city where you don't need a car' to get around, where everyone has an affordable and accessible zero carbon choice in how they travel.

In addition to increasing the opportunities for safer and alternative

travel, the consultation focuses on improving key areas in the city with pavement widening, space for greenery and opportunities for street cafés.

The Leeds City Links consultation is part of a wider package of transformational works in the city centre. The closure of City Square has reduced through traffic from the area, which means that surplus road space can be reallocated to safer routes for alternative travel options and spaces to spend time in.

Proposed improvements include:

- Widened pavements, making it safer and easier to walk around the city centre
- Safer and easier places to cross the road at key junctions, including the busy Merrion Street junction

- New crossings for pedestrians and cycle users
- Opportunities for street cafés along Great George Street
- Protected cycle track, adding to the existing 10km of existing protected cycle track in the city centre
- Opportunities for improved greenery along the route

Councillor Helen Hayden, Leeds City Council's executive member for sustainable development and infrastructure, said:

"These new plans to transform the way people get around the city centre will help provide safer routes for alternative travel options for those that live, work in or visit our city.

"The delivery of major city centre schemes, like the closure of City Square, have helped to reduce general through traffic and free up space for greener and healthier travel choices.

"Importantly, the plans also make busy junctions in the city centre safer for pedestrians and cycle users, working towards the Vision Zero Strategy of eliminating road deaths and serious injuries on

"I'd urge everyone that uses the area to have their say in the consultation '

This scheme is being developed by Leeds City Council in partnership with the West Yorkshire Combined Authority.

Tracy Brabin, Mayor of West Yorkshire, said

"A reliable and inclusive transport network, which prioritises walking, cycling and public transport, is key to our plans for a stronger and better-connected region.

"This scheme is part of a multi-million-pound package of investment to help us achieve that.

"Your opinion matters, so please make the most of this opportunity to have your say and shape the proposals.'

A major construction milestone has taken place at the £26.5 million new White Rose Rail Station in south Leeds

Rail infrastructure specialist Spencer Group has now installed two new link bridges from the main station buildings to platform level at the new station, which is being built next to the White Rose Park between Morley and Cottingley on the main trans-Pennine route to Manchester via Huddersfield.

The new station will make it easier to walk, cycle and use public transport, connecting more people with jobs, training, education and leisure activities.

It will provide improved access to the White Rose Park, shopping centre

Alongside 80 cycle parking spaces, the scheme also includes better walking and cycling routes for local communities, including to the White Rose Shopping Centre and bus interchange.

## Consent Granted For Leeds Gateway Office Scheme

A planning application to redevelop a landmark site in Leeds city centre to deliver 77,000 sq ft of prime, best in class workspace has been approved by Leeds City Council.

A Joint venture partnership between Asset Capital and Prescient Capital purchased Wellington Plaza, a prominent 1980's former HQ building on Wellington Street, last year with plans for major redevelopment that would set new standards in business

The partnership has confirmed its intent to fund and deliver the £50 million scheme speculatively with a start on site by early 2024. This transformation of one of the last remaining standalone gateway sites in the heart of Leeds's West End business district is currently the only pipeline scheme of its calibre in the city centre to start on site in 2024.

Designed by Leeds based DLA Architecture, the approved plans will increase floor space availability from 21,000 sq ft to 77,000 sq ft with Grade A specification floorplates up to 10,000 sq ft. A total redesign of the buildings' façade is influenced by the local conservation area and ESG credential targets including BREEAM Outstanding, minimum NABERS 5 Star, Fitwell 3 Star and Wired Score Platinum

The internal space is designed to support the post-pandemic hybrid way of working with total flexibility for occupiers fit out. Communal spaces will include a large roof top terrace, sky lounge, and business lounge linked into reception for occupiers and their guests.

Daniel Newett, CEO at Asset Capital, the developer, said,

"We are delighted to secure planning consent to redevelop this important building in Leeds city centre that has lain vacant for some time now. We have plans to not only bring the site in line with its neighbouring Grade A premises but surpass this with a specification that the city has not yet seen, redefining the term 'super prime'."

Fox Lloyd Jones, strategic property advisors have been appointed joint office leasing agents for the scheme alongside Cushman & Wakefield and Knight Frank. Society Studios is appointed as branding and marketing consultants for the scheme.

With an anticipated eighteen month build programme, the development is expected to achieve completion for occupation by the Spring 2026.

The scheme is being delivered in partnership by the West Yorkshire Combined Authority, Munroe K, Leeds City Council, Network Rail and the Department for Transport.

Tracy Brabin, Mayor of West Yorkshire, said:

"We're determined to create a better-connected region where everyone has the same opportunity to get on in life.

"Investing in transport schemes that support economic growth, like the White Rose Rail Station, has a key role to play in that.

"This investment will bring new opportunities for people in nearby communities by boosting transport links, regeneration and jobs.'

The two link bridges were installed overnight over the course of two

A 1,200-tonne crane – about 200 times the weight of an elephant - was built on site. It had to be transported in sections and took a week to assemble with more than 25 lorry deliveries of components

The east link bridge, which had to be built in two halves and welded together on-site, is 40m long and weighed 84 tonnes.

The west link bridge is 20m long and weighs 46 tonnes.

The works follow the installation of platform canopy sections earlier this

Leeds City Councillor Helen Hayden, Executive Member for Sustainable Development and Infrastructure, said:

"It's really pleasing to see a significant milestone achieved in the construction of Leeds newest Rail Station. The changes when complete will improve access to the city centre for residents in surrounding neighbourhoods, visitors to Leeds and thousands of young people who learn in the city's schools and colleges each day. White Rose Station along with other improved transport links we're working on provide more opportunities to reduce our city's carbon impact and realise our economic potential."

David Aspin, CEO of Munroe K, said:

"Seeing the two foot bridges installed marks a significant milestone in the project and is real testament to the workmanship of the whole team at Spencer Group. In the recent weeks the station buildings have come to life as the external cladding has been added and now the passenger walkways. We're excited to see the progress continue as we head towards the new station opening next year.

Anna Weeks, Principal Programme Sponsor at Network Rail, said:

"It's always special to reach milestones such as this in the large-scale infrastructure projects that Network Rail supports alongside its partners. We're proud to be playing our part in delivering a new accessible railway station for local residents and the wider public, offering them more sustainable ways to travel into Leeds city centre and beyond."

Joe Bennett, Operations Director at Spencer Group, said:

"The installation of the two link bridges represents a major milestone in the project.

"We had to work around external obstacles with the bridge lifts, including gas main renewals on the main road, but it went very well. The station is now really beginning to take shape.

"We're excited to be working closely with our partners to deliver this important project, which will provide a significant upgrade to the rail

Topping Out Stage Reached For Major Hotel Development In Leeds



GMI Construction Group has completed the topping out stage of the landmark £62.7m Hyatt Hotel which is the final part of the prestigious Sovereign Square development in Leeds.

Situated next to the city's railway station, the 12-storey 305-bedroom hotel is a joint venture between Marrico LLP and Helios for UK Commercial Property REIT (UKCM) and Hyatt.

Aimbridge, a leading hospitality company, will operate the 140,000 sq. ft hotel, on behalf of UKCM, under a 25-year franchise agreement with Hyatt Hotels, which is growing its presence within the UK market. It will operate under the dual brands of Hyatt House and Hyatt Place, providing short and long stay accommodation for business and leisure guests.

Designed by Leeds-based DLA Architecture, the building is inspired by the city's merchandising and textile past – with the hotel's striking external façade set in a sophisticated arrangement of red terracotta, light beige brickwork withy detailing around the recessed double/triple height window bays that are in harmony with the surrounding architecture.

The ground floor frontages will sit behind a colonnade, with recessed detailing around the arch-heads and down the columns, with a glazed frontage behind. It also features meeting rooms, an on-site gym, a ground floor restaurant and bar extending into the public square, together with an independent rooftop bar with views over Leeds and the surrounding area.

GMI started work on site in May 2022 following the site's purchase from Leeds City Council. Around 190 jobs have been created during the construction phase, with 80 full-time jobs expected to be established upon

Steve Ford, Development Director at Marrico, said: "This is a project that delivers quality hotel accommodation into the epicentre of the city's dynamic commercial, retail, and leisure landscapes. Situated in a prime position, it will be operated by a leading global hotel operator and is sure to further raise Leeds' profile as a coveted destination for business and leisure travellers alike'

## **Market Is Top Of The Shops As Work Continues On £10m Renovation Scheme**



A multi-million pound renovation scheme is ushering in a bright and busy new era for the most historic part of Leeds Kirkgate Market.

Work on the £10m refurbishment of the market's 19th-century 'blockshops' area got under way last year, with the first phase of the Leeds City Council scheme now complete.

A total of 24 units have been fully renovated and improved with features such as new canopy fronts. electric roller shutters, extraction ducting, LED lighting and extra storage space.

Wider structural work has seen roofing repaired, walkways brightened up with new glazing, new guttering installed and floors lowered to enhance

The project team has also taken care to respect and protect the site's history, with heritage features such as herringbone brickwork being restored to their former

A further 24 units will be given similarly stylish makeovers when the second and final phase of the scheme begins in the next few weeks.

And the ongoing rebirth of the blockshops is hailed as a sign of the council's steadfast commitment to ensuring that Leeds Kirkgate Market remains one of the jewels in the city's retail crown.

Councillor Jonathan Pryor, Leeds City Council's deputy leader and executive member for economy, culture and education, said:

"Leeds Kirkgate Market is an important and muchloved part of life in our city and, as such, we're determined to keep on giving it the kind of care and

"The blockshops scheme is a fine example of how this approach is delivering real and tangible benefits, with its now-completed first phase set to make a huge difference to traders and customers alike

"The project has been designed to complement other investments by the council in the market, which I'm proud to say has recently been attracting more than 500,000 visitors per month.

"It's great to hear that the second phase of the blockshops scheme will be getting under way soon – it will be fascinating to watch as further improvements

take shape and help make this famous symbol of Leeds an even better place to shop and spend time.

Dating back to 1875, the blockshops are the oldest surviving structures at the market and comprise eight two-storey buildings linked by an infill glazed roof.

The renovation scheme has required meticulous planning and preparation on the part of the council and contractor Bermar, due to both the historic nature of the buildings and their position at the heart of the wider

A number of the refurbished units are now available to rent, while others are already in the process of opening up for business.

Three have been secured by Leeds-based charity Zest for an initiative called The Leeds Cookery School @ Kirkgate Market. Zest's units will offer a variety of community cooking programmes as well as bespoke cooking classes and corporate away day opportunities.

Leeds City College is also set to take up a unit for use as a vegan and vegetarian cafe, allowing catering and hospitality students and apprentices to gain valuable hands-on experience of running a business.

Other improvements and support delivered for the market by the council in recent times include:

The creation of the popular Market Kitchen street food hall and event space as part of a £14m refurbishment

The provision of more than £1.4m worth of rent concessions to help traders cope with the financial effects of the COVID-19 pandemic;

A freeze on rent increases that has been in place since

The council is also currently considering the potential for bringing a 'container-style' food village to part of the market's outdoor site, with a view to boosting footfall for traders based in that area.

A planning application has also been submitted by the council for the development of a new hotel, gym and commercial units on the George Street side of the

A commercial tender pack has been put together for businesses keen to learn more about the opportunities offered by the refurbished blockshops area. Packs can be obtained by e-mailing market.events@leeds.gov.uk.



Leeds City Council has issued an update on the current known impacts of Storm Babet, which brought high winds and heavy rain between October 19-21 2023.

Yellow and amber alerts for rainfall were issued by the Met Office across the storm. The high levels of rainfall resulted in a peak river level of 3.64m recorded at the Armley gauge on the river Aire. This is around 0.9m higher than the top of the typical range, but lower than levels recorded in previous events such as storm Ciara in 2020, or storms Dudley, Eunice, and Franklin in 2022.

Officers from a range of Leeds City Council services including flood risk management, resilience and emergencies and highways began working with partners from the Environment Agency to put plans into place as soon as the named storm was forecast. During

the event, they worked in conjunction with emergency services including West Yorkshire Police and West Yorkshire Fire and Rescue Service as well as community groups, flood wardens and Network Rail to monitor and respond to help keep people safe.

Fortunately, this preparation and combined action resulted in just a small number of flooding impacts recorded across the storm, all of which are being responded to by the council's flooding

On the afternoon of October 20, river levels on the Aire triggered the need for the Leeds Flood Alleviation Scheme (FAS) to be activated. The moveable weirs at Crown Point and Knostrop were lowered to allow more room in the channel, successfully defending the city centre from flooding.

This is the 9th time that the £50million scheme has been operated since its completion in 2017.

The Leeds Flood Alleviation Scheme phase 2 is under construction and will not provide the full level of protection until it is complete in spring 2024. Despite the full benefits of the scheme not yet being realised, there were some examples of the scheme already proving effective in certain areas, for example, the newly installed flood walls effectively protecting the Kirkstall Bridge Inn as designed.

As construction of flood defences are ongoing, there are many building sites near the river, and in areas that are prone to flooding. In the run up to the storm site operatives from our contractor partners successfully ensured that equipment and materials were moved or secured safely, including a pontoon being secured to the riverbed, following risk assessments, and fully considering the detailed forecast from the Environment Agency.

Despite this, there has been some impact to a small number of building sites. Council officers and our construction partners are already working diligently to resume work on the scheme, which will protect a further 1,048 homes and 474 businesses as well as doubling the standard of protection for the city centre.

Councillor Helen Hayden, Leeds City Council's executive member for sustainable development and infrastructure, said:

"Thank you to everyone who worked diligently over the weekend to keep us all safe, and to those who are continuing to improve our resilience to severe weather across Leeds. There is a huge amount of time that people give up when it comes to flood management, often on short notice and unsociable hours, that the public never see. That work is so important, and I would really like to stress my personal thanks to all involved'

Flooding affects many in our communities, and there are actions that we can all take to prepare and to keep ourselves safe:

- Do not attempt to travel through flood water, on foot, in a vehicle
- Create a flood plan for your home or business using the template from the Environment Agency

We often see fraudsters impersonating trusted brands to deceive the public but impersonating the very essence of those that protect consumers by pretending to be Trading Standards is disgusting and shows that these criminals have no limitations to how far they are willing to go to defraud people of their savings.'

This scam, which initially was reported in England only, has now spread throughout the United Kingdom, with the email and letter recently materialising in Scotland.

CTSI has informed Trading Standards services across the country of these emails and letters, and there are open investigations, including a prosecution, that are with consumer protection professionals working hard to protect the public from these scams.

Anyone who receives a letter of this nature letter should contact the Financial Conduct Authority (FCA) and their local Trading Standards

The FCA issued a warning to the public earlier this year.

Operation Broadway, a City of London Police Partnership to tackle investment fraud have successfully disabled more than thirty phone numbers that have been included on the scam letters, and they continue to proactively intercept these scammers in their tracks.

## Self Assessment Customers

Self Assessment customers are urged to be on the lookout for scam texts, emails and phone calls from fraudsters.

This warning comes as HM Revenue and Customs (HMRC) received more than 130,000 reports about tax scams in the 12 months to September 2023, of which 58,000 were offering fake tax rebates.

With around 12 million people expected to submit a Self Assessment tax

return for the 2022 to 2023 tax year before the 31 January 2024 deadline, fraudsters will prey on customers by impersonating HMRC.

The scams take different approaches. Some offer a rebate; others tell customers that they need to update their tax details or threaten immediate

Myrtle Lloyd, HMRC's Director General for Customer Services, said: "HMRC is reminding customers to be wary of approaches by fraudsters in the run up to the Self Assessment deadline. Criminals are great pretenders who try and dupe people by sending emails, phone calls and texts which mimic government messages to make them appear authentic. Unexpected contacts like these should set alarm bells ringing, so take your time and check HMRC scams advice on GOV.UK."

Customers can report any suspicious communications to HMRC:

- forward suspicious texts claiming to be from HMRC to 60599
- forward emails to phishing@hmrc.gov.uk.
- report tax scam phone calls to HMRC on GOV.UK.

HMRC works to protect the public from scammers. In the 12 months to September 2023, HMRC has responded to 60,000 reports of phone scams alone and got 25,000 malicious web pages taken down.

Customers do not need to wait until 31 January before filing their tax return, they can submit it before then but do not have to pay until the deadline, unless they choose to. Filing earlier allows them to find out what they owe sooner or if they are owed money, get their refund.

Help and support is available on GOV.UK to help customers complete their return, there is no need to call. HMRC has a wide range of online resources to help customers file a tax return including a series of video tutorials on YouTube and help and support guidance on GOV.UK alongside HMRC digital assistant, HMRC app, community forums and the help and support

## Public Losing Thousands To Scammers Impersonating CTSI

The Chartered Trading Standards Institute (CTSI) is warning consumers to be vigilant and not to respond to correspondence carrying the CTSI branding, which is currently in circulation and has nothing to do with the Institute.

Figures from one Local Trading Standards Authority shows losses of more than £16,000 to a bogus mail and email insurance scam impersonating CTSI  $\,$ that has been targeting the public for three years.

CTSI warns that this could be the tip of the iceberg as often scams going unreported, so the money being lost to scammers could be tenfold what CTSI has evidence of. Evidence also suggests that those receiving the letters are on 'target lists' having previously been the victims of different scams.

The letter in question, which uses CTSI branding, informs the recipient that Trading Standards has caught insurance scammers and that they should fill in a "creditors debt form," which is supposedly a compensation scheme but in actual fact serves as a means for fraudsters to gain access to personal details, including bank information, which puts respondents at risk of financial loss.

Chief Executive at CTSI, John Herriman, said: "These scammers show no sign of slowing down and although Trading Standards are working hard to take action against these despicable individuals it if important that the public are on guard and do not respond to letters or emails that appear to be from genuine organisations, like CTSI. Trading Standards are the very people that protect the public, so to see scams targeting our good name in this way is appalling and we want to raise as much awareness about this as possible to stop consumers being defrauded out of their hard-earned

## Grant Applications Open For Businesses To Boost Digital Enterprise

Digital Enterprise has secured £4.6 million funding from the UK Government through the UK Shared Prosperity Fund (UKSPF), to encourage ambitious businesses in West Yorkshire to take a technological leap to improve productivity, performance and competitiveness and achieve sustainable growth by investing in digital.

High Impact projects will take longer to complete, further reducing the time businesses have to apply for this next level of funding. Representatives from DE3 are encouraging businesses to come forward sooner rather than later, in order to take full advantage of the support available.

The new programme includes a streamlined application process that allows hardware, software, technology, connectivity and internet upgrades to be combined within a single application. Businesses will also receive

impartial advice and support from their dedicated Digital Advisor, who will be on hand throughout the application process to help them make the best use of digital solutions.

Digital Enterprise Programme Manager, Suzanne Bradbury, said: "We're here to support West Yorkshire based businesses looking to scale up. While we are not prescriptive about business sectors, this grant funding is for growth-focussed businesses, operating for more than three years that need investment in digital innovation to propel them to the next stage.

"We know businesses are facing a myriad of challenges and are increasingly having to do more with less in order to survive. Technology can play a key role in overcoming those challenges, and we are here to provide businesses in the region with the advice and financial support needed to help them progress and grow.

Since its launch in 2016, Digital Enterprise has provided over £12 million in funding and helped over 2,700 businesses through its grant funding and business support programme, including Leeds-based businesses White Label Loyalty and VTR North.

A book of historic lighthouse designs from the brilliant mind of Leedsborn engineering genius John Smeaton has gone on display in Leeds.

The beautiful first edition, penned by Smeaton himself, is among the fascinating objects featured in a new exhibition which has opened at Leeds Industrial Museum.

Its detailed pages include Smeaton's own first-hand account of the building of his famed Eddystone Lighthouse, and features a series of intricate maps, engravings and plans of a design adopted across the world.

The book itself took 35 years to complete, with this first edition being published in 1791 and dedicated by the author to King George III.

Recently featured on the BBC's Antiques Roadshow, the book is on loan from Leeds Central Library and is being displayed at the museum as part of Engineery, which explores the story of civil engineering and the huge impact

it has had on the world.

It coincides with the upcoming 300th anniversary of Smeaton, who was born near Whitkirk, Leeds, in 1724.

A self-taught engineer, instrument maker and astronomer, his pioneering approach to problem solving and commitment to improving the world around him saw him dubbed the "father of civil engineering."

Charged with designing a new lighthouse on Eddystone Rocks off the coast of Devon, Smeaton took his inspiration from the tapered trunk of an oak tree, combined with masonry which mimicked the kerbstones of London's pavements.

His radical idea also included the invention of a new form of hydraulic cement which would set under water.

Once completed, the lighthouse stood 59 feet high, and was first lit on

October 16, 1759, guiding ships safely through the notoriously perilous approach to what was one of the most important naval harbours in England.

John McGoldrick, Leeds Museums and Galleries' curator of industrial history, said: "John Smeaton was a true genius, who for much of his life focused his brilliant mind and prodigious intellect on the task of improving the world around him.

"He pioneered the field of civil engineering, inspiring many others to design and build projects which shaped the world around us in countless ways.

"Smeaton's story and legacy, like his designs, have stood the test of time and we're proud to be celebrating his many achievements and those who followed in his footsteps."

Other exhibits on display as part of Engineery include a lathe Smeaton crafted as a young engineer in Leeds and a medal he was awarded 1787 by the Royal Society of Arts.

They will be on show alongside more modern examples of engineering including the cylinder head from a Land Rover and a breathing aid designed and manufactured during the COVID-19 pandemic and used in more than 130 NHS hospitals.

As well as featuring in the exhibition, the Eddystone Lighthouse book has inspired Smeaton300, a city-wide project which celebrates Smeaton's life and legacy in partnership with Leeds 2023.

An accompanying exhibition by the Young Smeatonians and will also run alongside a programme of events and activities.

Councillor Jonathan Pryor, Leeds City Council's executive member for economy, culture and education, said: "Leeds is very proud to be the birthplace of John Smeaton, a genuine trailblazer in the field of engineering whose legacy can still be seen in the city today and all around the world.

"His innovations and those he inspired changed the face of Leeds and many other cities and it is testament to his place in history that we are still celebrating him three centuries later."

The Eddystone Lighthouse book has also been digitised thanks to a joint project with Leeds Libraries, The British Library and funded by Leeds2023. Visitors can now borrow a copy for free from Leeds Libraries using their library card.

The Big Bike Fix in Leeds - a charity which gives used bikes a new lease of life before gifting them to those who need them most - has renovated its workshop, thanks to a grant from enfinium. The funding was awarded to the charity by enfinium's nearby Skelton Grange energy from waste facility, which is currently under

Since launching in June 2020, the Big Bike Fix has refurbished over 1,100 bicycles and donated them back to the local community. The scheme enables people in low-income households and communities to access active travel for free, in turn contributing towards improved wellbeing and better air quality in the area.

"There's so many opportunities for volunteering with WiSE – all which are all different and require a different set of skills. I love volunteering at the Welcome Café - I am interested in the number of new people dropping in and like to welcome them and signposting other activities.

"The weekly craft session is a different vibe completely. The group is well established with the same clients attending each week, so I'm able to get to know them on a more personal level and be able to offer advice for any problems they may be facing in their lives. I also volunteer at Line Dancing, the Tea Dance and Elderberries, plus many of the one-off events.

"Choosing my favourite activity is difficult as they are all varied, but I must admit that although the most physically demanding, the teamwork needed at the Welcome Café as we prepare and serve the food and drink is very rewarding.

"Far be it for me to give the impression that volunteering is all about giving. I have gained so much myself over the years, having made many friends with the volunteers and clients. It has just become what I do during the week, and I would recommend to anyone with time to spare to take on such a fulfilling role. Since being widowed, WiSE has also become a lifeline for me helping to fill an enormous gap in my life.

"WiSE has changed the lives of so many people, giving them the opportunity to meet and talk to others in comfortable and safe surroundings. I am proud to be part of that ethos."


## GARDENING

# Leaves Are Scattered All Over The Lawn, These Long Dark Mornings Do Make Me Yawn



As we head towards the end of 2023, the garden starts to prepare itself for whatever lies ahead. On the whole, plants are quite resilient and seem to cope reasonably well with the changing seasons. We have been harvesting and storing produce from the kitchen garden and although we are far from self sufficient, we do grow enough to have something from the garden most days. The joy of eating home grown produce and the taste make the effort worthwhile, despite the fact that it may be cheaper to buy from a large supermarket chain. It's not just about eating produce the whole journey from seed to harvest is as good for your mental wellbeing as it is for your diet.

As the temperature drops and the crispy crystals (frost) arrive it's important to look at plants that need winter protection. Although in some areas and very sheltered parts of the garden it may be possible to leave plants such as dahlias in the garden, there is no guarantee that they will survive, especially if we have a very cold winter. Lifting and storing plants in a frost free place can be a chore and these days maintaining a frost free place can be quite a cost. We have a closed garage and a wooden potting shed, which we don't heat but do provide a frost free place where we overwinter plants such as dahlias that don't have any leaves on in storage, so don't really need any light. Just check on them every three to four weeks to make sure they are not going mouldy or too dry. The critical time is as the weather starts to warm up next February, as they might start to shoot, in which case they will need a place with some light.



Ideally a frost free greenhouse or conservatory will do. I take late cuttings of many of our tender perennials used in pot displays and keep them in a

greenhouse, but a windowsill would do. We then lift the mother plant, remove about 50% of the soil and pack in trays lined with old greenhouse insulation or bubble plastic, then packed around with wood chippings, from the workshop or you could use bark chips. This insulates the rootball and allows air to circulate. Strangely this freezes less than when packed with soil or compost.



Garlic is one of those vegetables that you either love or hate, but you can't beat it for adding flavour to many dishes, and now is an ideal time to plant out in the garden, as it benefits from a period of cold to help it produce a good crop. Garlic is available from your local nursery or garden centre, or indeed online, it looks just like the garlic you buy in the supermarket although using 'shop' bought is not good idea as it is probably a variety suitable for a warmer climate. When planting carefully separate the individual cloves, choose a part of the vegetable garden that is reasonably sheltered, with good free draining soil. Cloves should be planted about 15cm(6ins) apart in rows 30cm(12ins) between the rows. Pointed end uppermost plant the clove so the top is about 2.5cm (1in) below soil level. I have grown the cultivars, Solent Wight and Carcassonne Wight with good results. It may take a little while for the shoots to appear and growth is slow through the colder months. Give them a dressing of general fertiliser in late Feb - early March, and water in dry spells. they should be ready for harvest in late July early August, the foliage starts to turn yellow and flops over. If your soil is wet and heavy, why not try growing a few in a large pot?

At this time of year you will often hear the term 'Bare Root' or 'Open Ground' plants are available. This refers to the fact that the plants have been grown outside in the nursery as opposed to pots. They are generally cheaper to buy but are only available when the plants are dormant through late autumn int early spring. The are lifted with only a little soil on the roots and if you are unable to plant them straight away then either store them in a frost free place, making sure the roots don't dry out or take a trench out in a sheltered part of the garden, place the roots in the trench and cover with soil. Plant them as soon as you can as once they are in the ground they will settle and root into the soil. Even though the soil may be damp, water the plant in as this ensures the soil is in good contact with the roots. Current guidance suggests that you don't need to add compost and fertiliser to the planting hole but to be honest I haven't found any difference although our soil is fairly light and the roots can run freely, so I like to give them a little sprinkle of general fertiliser.

There always seems to be something in the garden that needs tying up, a wayward rose stem, rampant sweet peas or floppy perennials, the choice of tying materials is considerable and there seems to be a new invention every year.

When I trained as a gardener all we had was 'Jute' a light brown straw coloured coarse woven twine, not only can you purchase every colour of garden twine imaginable but there are also lots of different materials too, many of which are of plastic origin. Maybe we should go back to twine which is organic, natural and biodegradable?

There is however an art to using twine and avoiding the ball collapsing or becoming so tangled its only good for throwing at the wall. There are two key tips, firstly find a screw top container that the ball of twine will fit into, make a small hole in the lid through which you can thread the twine, and secondly don't take the outer wrapper off the string but poke your finger into the middle (They are usually hollow in the middle) and fish out the end of the string. That way as you use the string it will not collapse and should remain tangle free. We use an old Branston pickle jar that was my Mum's, (other pickle jars are available) and it still has years of life left in it.

There are occasions when we don't use garden twine, and for sweet peas, we use wire rings, some are just wire and some plastic coated but essentially they are a split ring of wire and you simply open the ring, place it around the cane or support and the sweet pea stem and gently squeeze it together, hey presto the stem stays in place. The advantage is it is quick and easy and they can be used year after year.

Other options include plastic clips, rubber coated twisty wire and paper coated twist ties, but there are many more.

"Our youth groups aim to connect children to nature in a fun and informal way, which will in turn inspire and empower them to become advocates for nature, both now and in the future."



Routine scrolling on your mobile or tablet can be a fatal distraction to the driver. Anything from a bright screen to an interesting video can easily drag a driver's attention away from the road. The fine for this is not fixed but can potentially be as serious as careless driving.

#### Stop In The Name Of The Law

In the UK, even the simple act of waving someone to cross the road can be legally problematic. If a passenger signals a pedestrian to cross, they could be held accountable for a potential accident. While there are no set fines, liability could extend to court action.

Dominic Wyatt advises, "Educate yourself and ensure everyone in your car is aware of these rules. Awareness is crucial not only to prevent fines but also for everyone's safety on the road."

#### Rules Broken By Backseat Drivers

Although this is not a legal breach, backseat driving can test patience levels with the driver and lead to arguments. Such incidents can lead to the driver getting distracted, which might result in an accident or violation of driving laws.

#### **Express Caution With Expressions**

Obscene gestures and verbal abuse from a passenger can result in a driving penalty for 'disorderly behaviour. The driver can face penalty points or a fine of up to £1000.

#### Disruptive Children Or Pets

Children or pets causing a significant distraction can invite fines for the driver. They should always be appropriately restrained as per rule 57 and 100 of the Highway Code.

To avoid surprises during your next trip, Dominic Wyatt recommends that you "Make it a rule for passengers to stay calm and collected, and always keep seat belts fastened. As a driver, remember it's not just about how you drive but also about ensuring everyone in the car complies with the rules. Stay informed and vigilant."

So, next time you are on the road, remember that car regulations don't only apply to drivers. As passengers, your actions, your conduct can make a significant difference to safety and legality on UK roads. Everyone has a part to play. So, buckle up, stay attentive and keep the journey safe for all.

# One In Four Fooled Into Buying Unhealthy Pups By Gute' Pictures On Social Media

New research, released recently by one of the biggest dog welfare organisations, has uncovered the disturbing influence of social media on dog buying in the UK and the consequences for canine welfare.

Revealed as part of The Kennel Club's Be Puppywise campaign, statistics show one in four puppies (25%) found on social media get sick or die before their first birthday.

Thousands more unsuspecting dog owners who buy this way experience complications, with six in 10 (61%) facing unexpectedly high financial costs, a quarter (25%) admitting their dog had behavioural issues they weren't expecting, and one in five (18%) regretting their decision.

According to the research, double the amount of would-be owners are turning to social media sites to find a puppy compared to five years ago. However, The Kennel Club is warning that platforms like Instagram and TikTok give unscrupulous breeders easy access to a mass market, where they are selling puppies with little scrutiny, and

deceptively appealing to millions of unaware buyers with 'cute' and cleverly curated pup pictures and posts.

The research also highlights that instead of conducting thorough searches about their puppy's background, would-be owners who are finding dogs on social media are being drawn in by 'cute' photos. One in two (52%) bought their puppy 'because it was cute' and more than half (56%) admit it was the 'cute puppy photo' that most appealed in their pet's advert. A further quarter of puppy buyers (24%) who found their pup on these platforms worryingly spent less than two hours doing their research, leaving them particularly vulnerable to scams and unable to spot the signs of puppy farms.

Of those finding puppies on social media, the organisation has found thousands are also missing red flags in the process, leaving a yawning knowledge gap about how the pup has been bred and by whom:

• Two in three (68%) didn't see their puppy interacting with their mum and littermates

- And 64% suspect they didn't see their puppy's breeding environment
- An overwhelming 81% weren't asked about their suitability for dog ownership by the breeder
- More than three quarters (78%) didn't see their puppy's vaccination records

The Kennel Club is warning that duplicitous breeders are exploiting this lack of awareness – almost one in three puppies (32%) found on social media are suspected to have originated from a puppy farm.

The research also highlights that, despite the worrying consequences of making hasty and uninformed decisions based on what has been seen online, social media has an increasingly powerful influence; more than one in two puppy buying decisions (54%) are influenced by social media and nearly three in 10 (27%) said that when buying their puppy, their main information source was either social media, influencers or celebrities – over vets, dog welfare organisations and breed experts.

"In today's carefully curated digital world, enticing photos are the lifeblood of social media and pictures of puppies grab attention – so there is an obvious appeal to buying and selling puppies using these platforms," commented Mark Beazley, Chief Executive at The Kennel Club, which is urging responsible buying via its 'Be Puppywise' campaign. "But if people forget that behind every cute photo on social media, there is a real puppy, and a real need to ensure that their health and welfare has been prioritised, then there can be truly devastating consequences.

"Platforms like Instagram and TikTok can give unscrupulous breeders easy access to a mass market, where they are selling pups with little scrutiny, so it's down to the puppy buyer to make sure that they ask the right questions, see the puppy, with their mum and in their home environment, and step back if things don't feel right. Failing to do so can lead to a world of heartache for puppy buyers and keeps rogue breeders in business, whilst puppies continue to suffer the consequences, as this research shows."

## 360-Day Adoption Wait For West Yorkshire Dog Whose Tail Won't Stop Wagging

The RSPCA has launched a special appeal for an overlooked dog who has spent nearly a year in rescue waiting to be adopted.

Zeus, a loveable four-year-old Staffie cross, has been at the charity's Leeds, Wakefield & District Branch animal centre in East Ardsley since November 2022 and is currently one of the RSPCA's longest-staying dogs in the north of England.

But despite his happy demeanour, constantly wagging tail and love of human company, Zeus has yet to find his perfect match, and staff says he is sadly beginning to lose his spark as his first anniversary in kennels approaches.

The RSPCA is highlighting his story to shine a light on the many animals like Zeus who are still waiting for their forever home. The charity's rehoming centres are full as more pets come into rescue than are being adopted, with a six percent increase in dogs and a four percent rise in cats reported between 2021 and 2022.

Zeus' search for a home comes after a three-year collapse in rehoming rates. In 2022, the RSPCA rehomed 27,535 animals falling 30% compared with 2019, when 39,178 were rehomed.

He arrived at the East Ardsley centre suffering from mange, which was successfully treated. But it soon became clear he didn't like other dogs, and staff and volunteers have spent the past year focusing on helping him to understand that canines are not as scary as he thinks.

Megan Rattray, animal care manager at the centre, said: "Zeus is a really happy, playful boy who loves toys and games and adores people. Unfortunately he doesn't like other dogs at all, and can be aggressive towards them, and inevitably this has made it harder for us to find him a new home.

"A potential adopter will need to be understanding about this and in return the humans in his life will be rewarded with lots of love and affection from big-hearted Zeus.

"He's sadly lost a little bit of his spark as he's been with us for so



long. Despite this, he's a really lovely dog who has so much going for him.

"He's intrigued by everything and can be quite nosey at times! He's also a very quick learner and his training has come on in leaps and bounds - he's even worked out how to open his handler's treat bag and steal all the tasty ones!

"He'll make a wonderful companion and he'd love nothing more than a family of his own with people who will have plenty of time for games of tug and cuddles on the sofa." Zeus's preferred home is in a household as an only pet with children aged 16 or above, ideally somewhere quiet or rural with no dogs living next door. He's a quick and clever learner who loves his training, something his new owners will need to be willing to continue.

# 91-Year-Old Paratrooper Veteran Completes Charity Walking Challenge For Dogs Trust Leeds



Jeffrey Long, a 91-year-old paratrooper veteran from Bingley in West Yorkshire, successfully completed a 50 kilometer charity walking challenge in support of Dogs Trust Leeds. Over the past 15 years, Mr. Long has raised £400,000 for various charitable causes, and his latest endeavour has raised just under £250 for the dog welfare charity.

He embarked on this walking challenge, despite undergoing daily chemotherapy treatment. His mission was to make a difference in the lives of countless dogs in need through this challenge for Dogs Trust Leeds.

Since 2007, Jeffrey Long has been an ardent fundraiser, and in recognition of his voluntary services, he was appointed a Member of the Order of the British Empire (MBE) in 2010. Jeffrey has undertaken dozens of charity hikes. One of his most notable achievements was walking 650 miles from London to Lausanne in Switzerland while carrying a 30kg backpack.

## New Rules Come Into Force - XL Bully Dogs

The Government has added XL Bully type dogs to the list of dogs banned under the Dangerous Dogs Act to protect the public following a concerning rise in fatal attacks.

Under the new rules, which come into force at the end of the year, it will be illegal to breed, sell, advertise, exchange, gift, rehome, abandon or allow XL Bully dogs to stray in England and Wales.

From this date, these dogs must be kept on a lead and muzzled in public. Owners of XL Bully dogs are recommended to start training their dog to wear a muzzle and to walk on a lead ahead of the legal restrictions coming into force.

Breeders have also been told to stop mating these types of dogs from now in preparation of it being a criminal offence to sell or rehome these dogs.

From 1 February 2024 , it will then become illegal to own an XL Bully dog if it is not registered on the Index of Exempted Dogs. By staggering these two dates, current owners of this breed will have time to prepare for these new rules.

Owners who wish to keep their dogs will have until the end of January to register them and will be forced to comply with strict requirements. As well as being muzzled and kept on a lead in public, these dogs must also be microchipped and neutered.

Dogs under one year when the ban comes in must be neutered by the end of the year, older dogs must be neutered by the end of June. "I'm a doggy man, and I'm well aware of Dogs Trust and the valuable work it does. Therefore, I decided to do a walk in support of Dogs Trust.

Jeffrey Long shared his thoughts on his latest challenge:

Dogs Trust is special to me because the charity takes in dogs that may have come from a pound, a dog warden or as strays. They look after those dogs, train them if necessary and do the best to find the perfect home for them."

Emma Wakefield, Rehoming Centre Manager at Dogs Trust Leeds, expressed her gratitude for Jeffrey's efforts:

"We are truly in awe of Jeffrey's determination and dedication to our cause. His support means the world to us, and the funds he has raised will go a long way in providing a brighter future for the dogs in our care. Jeffrey is an inspiration to us all, and we are immensely thankful for his generosity and unwavering commitment to the welfare of dogs."

From 1 February, owners without a Certificate of Exemption face a criminal record and an unlimited fine if they are found to be in possession of an XL Bully type, and their dog could be seized.

Owners may choose to have their dog put to sleep by a vet, with compensation provided to help with these costs. Further details on how to apply for compensation and the evidence required to make a claim will be provided soon.

As part of the process, the definition of the 'XL Bully' breed type has also been published. This follows meetings of an expert group, convened by the Environment Secretary and made up of police, local authority, vets and other animal welfare experts to help define the breed. The definition provides clear assessment criteria for owners and enforcement authorities and is a requirement under the Dangerous Dogs Act in order to deliver the ban.

Owners can access the most up to date information on what action they need to take and when on this dedicated page, Prepare for the ban on XL Bully dogs - GOV.UK (www.gov.uk).

Owners whose dogs are dangerously out of control are already breaking the law, and the enforcement authorities have a full range of powers to apply penalties to them. Under the Dangerous Dogs Act, people can be put in prison for up to 14 years, be disqualified from ownership or their dangerous dogs can be euthanised.

Leeds Teaching Hospital NHS Trust (LTHT) is celebrating its 5,000th case of robotic-assisted surgery using the da Vinci Surgical System.

LTHT installed its first da Vinci system in 2005 and is now home to three of the most advanced robotic systems from Intuitive, which are used by surgeons to treat patients across eight surgical specialities in Leeds, including cancer treatment and specialist care for children.

More patients than ever before at Leeds are benefitting from the improved clinical outcomes of robotic-assisted surgery, such as faster recovery times, reduced length of stay, fewer complications, fewer readmissions, with the need for conversion to open surgery far less likely.

Last year, two older robotic systems across the Trust received updates and a brand-new model was introduced to the Leeds robotic surgical suite based at St James's University Hospital. Since then, the number of patients receiving robotic-assisted surgery for cancer treatment has more than doubled

The da Vinci systems provide the surgeon with an advanced set of instruments for minimally invasive surgery. By inserting a tiny camera inside the patient, the surgeon directs the robotic arms from the surgeon console, which translates the surgeon's hand movements in real time, bending and rotating the instruments while performing the procedure, allowing for far greater precision than traditional laparoscopic or open surgery.

Prof. Phil Wood, Chief Executive at LTHT, said:

"It's a very exciting time for Leeds. We're already one of the biggest robotic surgical centres in the NHS and our Paediatric Robotic programme at Leeds Children's Hospital is one of the largest internationally.

"We believe our recent investments in our da Vinci systems are now paying off for both our patients and our surgical teams. With this 5,000th patient, it's clear more patients than ever before are benefitting from robotic-assisted surgery, and we can look forward to even more people receiving those benefits as more surgeons are trained to do other procedures using the system."

He added: "This impressive milestone demonstrates our commitment to delivering world-class care and for making Leeds an international centre of excellence for robotic surgery."

Matthew Millott, Deputy Team Leader – Robotics at St James's Hospital in Leeds, said:

"Thanks to the number of procedures now possible using robotic-assisted surgery and some careful theatre scheduling and co-ordination, we are seeing tremendous benefits as it means we can treat more patients sooner, which is great news for patients who are waiting for surgery.

"For some patients who received robotic-assisted surgery, the hospital stay has reduced from more than a week to just one or two days, such as with the newly implemented Nephroureterectomy programme. As a result, we are enabling more and more patients to get on with their lives after surgery, much faster than before."

He added: "Robots aren't replacing anyone – we still need highly-skilled surgeons to operate the da Vinci systems, and we have an excellent professional team including dedicated robotic surgical assistants, nurses, operating department practitioners, and anaesthetists who are all needed to make this happen."

## Seven Technologies Recommended To Help People With Non-Specific Low Back Pain

People with low back pain could be offered apps to help them manage their condition after seven digital technologies were recommended by NICE in draft guidance.

An independent NICE committee evaluating the seven digital technologies said they could be offered to those aged 16 years and over with non-specific low back pain. Some of the apps are designed to help people with new back pain and others for people who have had the issue for more than 3 months and some apps help both groups.

The apps offer a variety of support including:

- access to a multi-disciplinary team to answer questions/give advice via video or email/ messages
- Guided exercise advice with video demonstrations
- Nudge functions to encourage and remind people to complete tasks such as filling in questionnaires or their exercises

Some offer access to psychological treatment including access to pain specialists and psychologists, or a programme of video tutorials on managing pain, and mindfulness sessions.

The draft recommendation of the digital platforms aims to reduce inequalities in accessing musculoskeletal services across the country. Other benefits envisaged include reducing waiting lists, the number of GP and physiotherapy appointments, the use of medication and the potential need for surgery.

The technologies – which are web-based applications and digital platforms – can be used by NHS patients while further evidence is generated over the next three years to evaluate their clinical and cost-effectiveness. Evidence will be generated in several areas including the length of time people use the apps for before they feel better to return to normal activities.

A patient would be assessed by a GP or other healthcare professional before they could be offered the digital treatments. Some apps provide initial triage and assessment making it possible for people with symptoms of low back pain to self-refer to the platforms as an additional support to non-pharmacological treatment.

The NHS Long Term Plan states that low back pain is the biggest cause of disability. Musculoskeletal conditions account for 30% of GP consultations annually and according to UKHSA, there are 9.11 million people living with long-term back pain in England.

Health Minister Will Quince said: "These apps are yet another example of how technology can be used help patients get the care they need, when they need it.

"They offer a range of services which will allow patients to manage lower back pain from the comfort of their homes by improving access to musculoskeletal services – which will form a key part of our Major Conditions Strategy.

"This will help to reduce pressures on the NHS and can help to cut waiting lists - one of the government's top priorities – and will help people to live happier, healthier lives."

NICE's guideline on low back pain and sciatica in over 16s: assessment and management recommends low back pain self-management, exercise, manual therapies, psychological therapy, combined physical and psychological programmes as well as return to work programmes.

The technologies recommended in the draft guidance, can be used once they have appropriate regulatory approval and meet the standards within NHS England's Digital Technology Assessment Criteria.

David Marante, UK Regional Director of Intuitive, the maker of the da Vinci robotic-assisted surgical system, said:

"We'd like to congratulate the team at Leeds Teaching Hospitals for reaching 5,000 procedures using the da Vinci system. It has been a privilege to work with the team as they have expanded their robotic surgery programme to provide more patients with access to minimally invasive surgery."

Carol Stott, 72 and from Leeds, is the 5,000th patient to have undergone robot-assisted surgery at LTHT. She said:

"I didn't know what to expect when I was told about robot-assisted surgery. It seemed marvellous, and when it was explained it to me, I was really put at ease. It was a big team who looked after me – they were all really delighted by the outcome. I remember lying in bed after the procedure feeling elated."

She added: "Everyone was amazed with how well I was so quickly after the operation. My friends visited the following week and couldn't believe it. I've been looked after so well."

Leeds Children's Hospital became the first hospital in the UK to install a robotic system dedicated to performing paediatric surgery in 2005. This was replaced in 2015 with a newer system thanks to a charitable donation.

As one of the country's leading teaching hospitals the formation of a robotic case observation centre has allowed for surgical peers and trainees to observe live robotic surgery and learn from experienced robotic surgeons.

It has meant Leeds has gained a reputation as a centre of excellence, attracting surgeons wishing to train within the robotic specialty from across Europe.

With dual console capabilities, trainees at Leeds teaching hospitals can get hands on experience with the da Vinci system during their training, learning valuable skills for their future surgical careers.

## Treatment For Parkinson's Set To Benefit Hundreds

Around 900 adults with advanced Parkinson's are set to benefit from new treatment foslevodopa-foscarbidopa after NICE approved it for NHS use in final draft guidance.

NICE has recommended foslevodopa—foscarbidopa (also called Produodopa and made by AbbVie) as an option for treating advanced Parkinson's, a progressive disorder that affects the nervous system and the parts of the body controlled by the nerves. It is recommended for adults whose symptoms include severe changes in their ability to move (motor fluctuations) and involuntary, abnormal, and excessive movements (known as dyskinesia), when other treatments are not working well enough.

The treatment is delivered by an infusion pump, which gives the medicine over 24 hours. The device is small, completely portable and can be refilled at home, which is convenient for patients and their carers, and helps people manage their symptoms effectively.

It works by releasing the drugs foslevodopa and foscarbidopa into the body where foslevodopa is turned into the chemical dopamine, which is used to transmit messages between the parts of the brain and nerves that control movement. Taking foslevodopa with foscarbidopa increases the availability of foslevodopa in the brain.

Oral treatment with levodopa and carbidopa is the standard initial treatment for Parkinson's, but as the disease progresses other medicines may be added. Non-oral treatments that may be used in advanced levodopa-responsive Parkinson's include apomorphine (a drug given as an injection to act like dopamine to stimulate nerve cells), deep brain stimulation through surgery or levodopa—carbidopa intestinal gel.

As a potential new option for advanced Parkinson's, the company asked for foslevodopa—foscarbidopa to be considered only for people who cannot have apomorphine or deep brain stimulation surgery, or for when these treatments no longer control symptoms. So foslevodopa—foscarbidopa was only considered as an alternative to standard oral treatment and levodopa—carbidopa intestinal gel.

Evidence from a clinical trial suggests that foslevodopa–foscarbidopa improves motor symptoms compared with standard care.

This is the first technology appraisal from NICE to look at a treatment for Parkinson's. NICE has previously published clinical guidelines and medtech innovation briefings on Parkinson's.

At an earlier meeting NICE's independent appraisal committee, while not recommending foslevodopa–foscarbidopa, acknowledged its many potential benefits and the high unmet need for effective treatments for people with advanced Parkinson's.

The company then provided further details and updates on the economic models and the committee were able to recommend it for use on the NHS

The committee concluded foslevodopa-foscarbidopa may also have additional benefits, including improved non-motor symptoms, blood pressure and bladder control, and fewer problems with sleep and mood.

## Thousands Of Retired Staff Return To The NHS

More than a third of nurses who retired two years ago had returned to practice 12 months later, according to new NHS England figures.

Analysis of NHS workforce data found that 4,600 of 10,300 (44%) nursing staff that retired between July 2021 and June 2022 had rejoined the health service within 12 months -4 percentage points more than the previous year.

The increase comes after an extension to changes to the pension rules first introduced in 2020. This means that staff with the reserved right to retire at age 55 such as nurses, midwives, physiotherapists and health visitors, can retire and return to the NHS without it impacting their pension - even if they work full time.

Since 1 April 2023, they can also rejoin the pension scheme and build further pension if they wish.

It also comes after NHS England made it mandatory for NHS organisations to offer staff flexible working options for every role.

Across the wider NHS the retire and return rate was 37% over the last year, with 12,800 out of 34,500 members of staff who retired in the 12 months up to June 2022 returning to work within the following 12 months.

Staff who retire and return to practice tend to do so on reduced hours, with nurses reducing their hours by roughly a third, compared to staff overall reducing their hours by a fifth on returning to practice.

Those aged between 55 and 59 are more likely to retire and return than those aged over 60. Almost half (48%) of all NHS staff, and more than half of nurses (56.3%), who retired between 55 and 59 later returned to work

The NHS Long Term Workforce Plan published earlier this year said that changes to the pension scheme to allow more staff to return to work after retirement, alongside improved flexible working options and better opportunities for career development could mean that up to 130,000 staff stay working in the NHS longer over the next 15 years.

Since 1 October 2023, a new 'partial retirement' option has been available to staff as an alternative to full retirement. Subject to a reduction in pensionable pay, staff can now draw down some or all their pension whilst continuing to work and build up further pension.

Health technology companies in West Yorkshire will be able to bid for funding of up to £1 million to help develop life changing medical innovations for use in the NHS and across the world, Mayor Tracy Brabin has announced.

Due to the emerging strengths of the region's £5 billion health technology sector (healthtech), the Mayor of West Yorkshire has secured £7.5 million of new investment — hailed as a "game changer" for businesses and patients.

The funding will be distributed to businesses which can demonstrate that they will have a positive impact on patient care through an innovative new medical, diagnostic or digital health solution.

The new multi-million-pound partnership between the Mayor and Innovate UK, part of UK Research and Innovation (UKRI), comes days after £5 million was announced by UKRI for the medical technology sector across Yorkshire, which employs over 16,000 people across 250 companies.

Tracy Brabin, Mayor of West Yorkshire, said:

"This groundbreaking new partnership is a major vote of confidence in the future of our brilliant healthtech businesses, who are transforming the lives of patients world-wide.

"That we were able to secure this funding is a testament to the strength of our sector, the talent of our homegrown scientists and researchers, and our ambition to transform the NHS through innovation.

Home to the headquarters of NHS England and some of the strongest academic and clinical research facilities in the country, West Yorkshire is an incubator for many leading healthtech companies.

Companies working on devices and technologies that could improve patient care will be able to apply for competitive grants ranging from £25,000 to £1 million.

The £7.5 million "launchpad" programme will help them develop the innovations all the way from the lab through to clinical trials and on to global health markets.

Eligible businesses include those seeking to help the NHS prevent, diagnose and treat major physical health conditions including cancer, strokes and dementia, as well as mental health conditions.

Huddersfield-based Paxman Scalp Cooling, which helps cancer patients undergoing chemotherapy by minimising their hair loss, has almost quadrupled its team from 25 to over 90 people over the past six years, with a large proportion of those working in West Yorkshire.

Richard Paxman OBE, CEO of Paxman Scalp Cooling and private sector representative on the West Yorkshire Combined Authority's Business, Economy and Innovation Committee, said:

"This is such positive news for the region, further strengthening an already exciting opportunity for West Yorkshire and the North.

"This type of non-dilutive funding provides such an impact for SMEs in our region and sector, reducing the risk of investment and expediting the lengthy pathway often leading to speedier commercialisation and therefore a positive impact both socially and financially to all stakeholders.

"In addition, it also can really attract future investment into companies from other sources, further supporting growth for the company and the region. West Yorkshire is an exciting place to be at the moment and pleased to see further momentum in our sector."

The funding was secured by the Mayor in conjunction with the West Yorkshire Health and Care Partnership, Health Innovation Yorkshire and Humber, Leeds Teaching Hospitals NHS Trust, the Universities of Bradford, Huddersfield and Leeds, as well as industry partners Medilink North of England, Medipex, and the Association of British Healthtech Industries.

The competition in West Yorkshire runs until 13 December.

After businesses submit bids for funding, these will be reviewed by Innovate UK by February 2024, with new projects expected to start in May 2024
